Overview	Outdoor Educators are responsible for leading, organising and delivering a comprehensive and safe educational program.				
	The ideal person will have a passion for educational field work, and possess a broad range of knowledge and skills that will assist students to participate in a variety of physically challenging activities and environments.				
	To succeed in this role, you should be physically fit, adaptable to multiple and unpredictable environments, have a commitment to working safely and have a friendly, calm and approachable attitude, suitable for working in a small team and with students.				
	The objectives of outdoor education are to provide students with an opportunity to develop:				
	 awareness of the environment personal accountability, responsibility and teamwork skills a strong sense of community leadership and problem-solving skills recreational skills 				
	Physical requirements for this role include: bushwalking, cycling, canoeing, rock climbing, cross country skiing, surfing, mountain bike riding, snorkelling and camping.				
	The role of the Outdoor Educator is to:				
Duries and Responsibilities	 plan, participate and evaluate outdoor education programs, day trips and excursions as required 				
	 lead and instruct outdoor education programs as required 				
	 prepare, collect and collate all necessary documentation including bookings, parent permission forms, risk management documentation, council permits, land owner permissions and licences as required 				
	 ensure all activities have been budgeted for, with invoices and expenses submitted for approval in line with College processes 				
	 prepare risk management documentation for outdoor education programs and activities, ensuring all appropriate risk mitigation actions are implemented in line with College requirements 				



	 source, purchase and prepare all food, ensuring that individual needs have been catered for e.g., allergies 			
	 ensure all equipment for outdoor activities is in good working order, clean and well maintained prior to and after each use 			
	 prepare all students for outdoor activities through classroom-based learning prior to participating in outdoor activities 			
	 ensure that all known medical conditions of participants have been considered and appropriate mitigation and response plans are understood 			
	 complete regular audits on equipment ensuring damaged, lost and faulty equipment is repaired, replaced and/or upgraded as required 			
	 transport or arrange transportation as required. If using a MacKillop bus then ensuring it is returned clean and with a full tank of petrol 			
	 assist homeroom teachers in the organisation for programs 			
	 regularly communicate and debrief with the Outdoor Education Leader after each outdoor activity, evaluating the successes and issues arise as they arise 			
	 record all incidents and providing relevant notes to the college first aid officer and Outdoor Education Leader 			
	 maintain accurate records of student attendance and participation 			
	 administer first aid in compliance with established guidelines. 			
	 ensure first aid kits are maintained and available for use in the field 			
	 always carry a phone to seek assistance as required from another team or emergency services 			
Communication	 ensure all marking requirements for student work and assessment tasks is completed, and feedback provided in a professional and timely manner 			
	 provide written reports for families which clearly reflect the student's approach to learning, performance on a range of assessment tasks, strengths, challenges and recommended future learning strategies 			
	 participate in Student Progress Interviews as required 			
	 initiate family contact in cases where student behaviour or academic performance need to be addressed 			
	 respond promptly to family requests for information, return phone calls and answer email 			
	 provide meaningful and regular feedback to each student on their progress
