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What are my options?

All certificates recognise and celebrate the various learning pathways:

VCE is the traditional academic VCE learning program that supports students going into Higher Education Scored Unscored – Only in Year 12 and requires an application

VCE Vocational Major (VCE VM) is a vocational and applied learning program within the VCE that supports students to develop academic and practical skills, knowledge and confidence to prepare for work and further education and training

Victorian Pathways Certificate (VPC) is designed for those students not yet ready to undertake the VCE or VCE VM

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Victorian Certificate of Education (VCE)

Scored and Unscored Pathways



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Victorian Certificate of Education (VCE)

Designed to be completed over 2 years

- Year 11 Unit 1 & 2
- Year 12 Unit 3 & 4

Students must satisfactorily complete a minimum of 16 units, which must include:

- \circ $\;$ Three units from the English group.
 - Unit 3+4 is compulsory, along with;
 - Unit 1 and/or 2
- Three Units 3 & 4 subjects, other than English (e.g. Unit 3 and 4 Business)
- Units are 100 hours in total with a minimum of 50 hours in class and 50 hours out of class



How will I be assessed?

1. SAC (School Assessed Coursework)

- Completed in class
- Graded assessment (eg test, essay)

2. SAT (School Assessed Task)

- Completed in class over an extended period of time, usually several weeks or even months
- SAT's occur in Art, Media, VCD, Software Development, Data Analytics and Product Design & Technology (Textiles and Materials, Tools and Processes

All SAC's and SAT's are marked internally

3. Examinations

• In Year 11, completed at the end of each semester, for every subject

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Victorian Certificate of Education Vocational Major

(VCE VM)



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VCE Vocational Major

- VCE Vocational Major (VM) is a vocational and applied learning program within the VCE
- VCE VM will prepare students to move successfully into apprenticeships, traineeships, further education and training, university through alternative entry programs or directly into the workforce
- VCE VM has specific subjects designed to prepare students for a vocational pathway



VCE Vocational Major

- Designed to be completed over 2 years:
 - Year 11 Unit 1 & 2
 - Year 12 Unit 3 & 4
- Students complete a <u>minimum</u> of 16 units, which must include:
 - Three Literacy units, two of which must be a Unit 3 & 4 sequence
 - Three sequences of Units 3 & 4 studies, other than Literacy
 - A minimum of 2 x Numeracy, 2 x Work Related Skills and 2 x Personal Development units
 - 180 hours of VET at Certificate II or above
 - Units are 100 hours in total with a minimum of 50 hours in class and 50 hours out of class

What is Workplace Preparation in the VCE VM?

- Structured Workplace Learning (SWL) preparation and organisation
- VET Course undertaken related to students Career Pathway (eg Plumbing, Electrical, Child Services, Carpentry, Health Services)
- VET Short Courses available as part of the program (eg White Card, RSA, Barista Training)
- Preparation time provided for larger projects

Note:

Students completing VCE VM are required to enrol in a VET course.



Victorian Pathways Certificate

(VPC)



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Victorian Pathways Certificate (VPC)

- A flexible certificate designed for students in Years 11 and 12 who would benefit from a more individualised program at a more accessible level than a senior secondary certificate
- VPC can help students move into a senior secondary qualification, entry level VET course or straight into a job



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Victorian Pathways Certificate (VPC)

Students must complete a <u>minimum</u> of 12 units, which must include at least:

- 2 x VPC Literacy units
- 2 x VPC Numeracy
- 2 x VPC Work Related Skills
- 2 x VPC Personal Development units
- Remaining units could include:
 - VCE VM units
 - VET (1 unit = 90 hours)



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Attendance for VCE, VCE VM and VPC



Minimum 90% attendance is required



As stated by the VCAA, units are made up of 100 hours of work. 50 hours of this must be in class per unit for VCE (Scored and Unscored), VCE (VM) and VPC



Attendance less than 80% (Approved or unapproved) could result in concerns with authentication of work required for an S result

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Higher Study... - doing a Unit 3&4 VCE Subject (Year 12 level) in Year 11



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VCE Eligibility

- Students who wish to study a VCE Unit 3 & 4 subject in Year 11, must have an average of 80% in English and in the subject area throughout Year 10 for the VCE subject they wish to complete e.g. 80% average in English and Science is required to do VCE Biology in Year 11
- Meet all eligibility criteria
- Attendance: 90% or above



If you are already doing a Higher Study in Year 10...

Students receiving:

- less than 60% on their SACs and final Unit 1 or 2 Semester exam should consider the appropriateness of completing that subject in Unit 3 & 4 in 2026
- an 'N' may not be allowed to complete subsequent unit of that subject



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Attendance

- Minimum 90 % attendance is required
- Consistent attendance at school is vital if students are to reach their potential
- Attendance less than 70% (Approved or unapproved) will significantly affect your ability to gain an 'S' for that subject. This becomes even more significant in VCE!
