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Something to think about for Year 10...



Students who wish to study a VCE subject in Year 10, must have an average of **80% in English** and obtain the relevant **average % in the subject area** throughout Year 9 for the VCE subject they wish to complete



Meet all eligibility criteria

Attendance: 90 % or above



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Minimum 90 % attendance is required

Consistent attendance at school is vital if students are to reach their potential

Attendance less than 70% (Approved or unapproved) may result in an 'N' for that unit
